

Extreme Weather Procedure

In the event of extreme weather such as snow, the School will take advice, where appropriate, from the relevant authorities. Wherever possible the School will remain open, although it cannot guarantee to run lessons and activities as normal. Senior members of the School, resident staff and other available members of staff who live locally will supervise children, and hot food will be available.

Leighton Park School has a wide catchment area and it is acknowledged that whilst conditions on the Park may be fine, this may not apply to other parts of the School's catchment area. If it is necessary to operate the extreme weather procedure, communication will be made in line with the School Snow Plan below.

Please note that no student or member of staff is expected to travel in poor conditions if doing so puts them or others at risk. Provided it is safe to travel all staff should travel to School unless differing advice is given on the website or by line managers.

To better coordinate our responses to snow please refer to the School's Snow Plan. The School will restrict its opening for day boarders if, in the opinion of the Head, and based on the best advice available to him at the time, the risk to students, parents and staff from travelling in to school is too great. Please note the following sources of information that you will need to monitor during the period covered by the Snow Plan:

3. Updates and information will be available by phone, in both the boarding houses, the main reception of the school and a specially dedicated phone line.

Exceptionally, there may still be times when the School has to close completely and this will be publicised on the School's website (please remember to press "refresh" if you are accessing the website over a period of time as this will allow access to updated information).

The school will only be closed to day boarders if one or more of the following conditions apply:

1. Insufficient staff are able to come in to keep the school running safely.
2. Conditions on site are dangerous.
3. Conditions are considered to be or are anticipated to later become too hazardous for travel.

Should the School have to close during the day this will also be announced on the website.

Facilities at the School will remain open for those students who cannot return home until their parents arrive and special provision will continue for our boarding community. The School taxi and bus company will be notified of an early closure and we would expect them to provide as full a service as is possible given the weather situation with a departure time as near to the time of closure as possible. We will not allow students to travel on the School bus or taxi without having first received permission from a parent or guardian.

We ask that parents ensure the School possesses full and accurate, up to date information of all contact details (home, work, mobile numbers and email addresses). Parents can provide this updated information either in writing or via email to info@leightonpark.com

Please ensure that in the event of an early or unexpected closure, you have notified your child's Housemaster or the School office giving permission for your child to leave early. No child will be allowed to leave School premises without such authorisation.
