## International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme Results

While some schools only recommend the IB Diploma for their top academic students, Leighton Park sees the value of the programme for individuals who have an international outlook, enjoy coursework and interdisciplinary projects.

One such student is Queralt Garrigos who achieved 39 out of 45 points and is going to study Aerospace Engineering in New York. Against the global average of 31.98, this year's cohort achieved an average of 33.
